SAPOL Visit

On Thursday 2 June we had a great visit from Senior Constable Nigel Allen (SAPOL) who presented to students the importance of safety on the road. The students were engaged during the 90 minute presentation and it was pleasing that they were willing to answer and ask questions during the presentation. The presentation was called *The Fatal Five* and is a powerful and interactive program that discusses road safety issues, including the causes of road crashes such as: fatigue, alcohol and drugs, speed, risk-taking, peer pressure, driver attitudes; and ways we can all reduce the risk of becoming a crash statistic. The whole presentation was excellent and gave much “food for thought” about the ways that we all interact on the road. 

SAPSASA Football & Netball

Bree North, Sophie O'Brien, Rebecca Sampson and Taeha Sampson played netball for Team 1, Division 3. Their coach was Susie Boylan and their manageress was Deb Taheny. Myher Beard and Zoe Tomney played for Team 2, Division 7. Their coach was Jussy Leinert and their manageress was Sue Woolford. The netball games consisted of 4 twelve minute quarters.

Netball Report by Myher and Zoe



