Reports

Student behaviour

Facilities

The student toilets will undergo further renovation with the removal of all asbestos from the building over the school holidays. **The school will be closed on Saturday 4, Sunday 5 and possibly Monday 6 July and no one will be allowed on site while the asbestos is being removed.**

Covid-19

We are keen for further restrictions to be lifted, but in the meantime we are still maintaining the processes to limit any spread of Covid19. We are practicing these at school including:

- Washing hands regularly, particularly after using the toilet and before eating
- Using alcohol based sanitiser in all classrooms
- Wiping down surfaces
- Covering a cough or sneeze with a tissue
- Avoiding touching eyes, nose and mouth








YEAR 4 NOTAN ART






